JOEL STIEBALE'S NEW RESEARCH PROJECT FUNDED BY THE LEIBNIZ ASSOCIATION

Joel Stiebale’s new research project on “Worker flows, match quality and productivity - Evidence from European micro data” will be funded by the Leibniz Association. The project analyzes the link between workers’ mobility and productivity in European countries. It addresses how various macro and micro shocks affect workers’ reallocation and productivity growth across countries with different labor market institutions. It will also analyze the effect of labor market institutions on the match quality between firms and workers, and their search behavior. This project is in cooperation with the

RWI Essen - Leibniz-Institute for Economic Research, the IfW - Kiel Institute for the World Economy, the University of Aarhus, and the University of Prague.
